Held in March, 2012**

The Board of Pondera County Commissioners met daily in informal session and in scheduled meetings on March 8, 14, and 21, 2012. A special meeting to finalize the levy request language for library funding was held on Monday, March 12, 2012 at 10:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' office. Unless indicated, all Commissioners were present.

PROPOSAL FOR WIRING AT ROAD SHOP ACCEPTED – March 8, 2012

UPDATE WITH KYLE HARLAN - March 8, 2012

Commissioner Johnson advised Harlan that the commissioners have not yet received a response from the State of Montana regarding the State's approval of the County's contract with Harlan. The Certificate of Occupancy has been sent to Nelson Architects who will be getting that to the County.

Commissioner Johnson asked Harlan if United Grains, who started their construction with approval from the State, would switch their inspection needs to Harlan upon certification of the County's contract with Harlan. It is Harlan's understanding that this switch will take place once the certification and/or approval are in place. BALLOT ISSUE CONSOLIDATION DISCUSSION AND ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION #28 – ALLOWING FOR THE CONSOLIDATION OF THE BALLOT ISSUE REQUEST OF THE VALIER LIBRARY AND THE CONRAD LIBRARY INTO ONE QUESTION ON THE BALLOT- March 8, 2012

The commissioners have approved requests of the Valier Library and of the Conrad Library to place tax levy requests on the June 2012 ballot. These requests were brought to the commissioners and approved at different meeting dates. Since the approval of the two individual requests, and upon discussion with the Montana Association of Counties, it was brought to the attention of the commissioners that the two questions, which are identical except for the dollar amount requested, would best serve the interests of the county and its voters if they were combined into one question on the ballot.

There was discussion of the combination, both pros and cons, among the commissioners, representatives of the Conrad Library (Janet Spears, Library Board Chair), Carolyn Donath, Director of the Conrad Library and Stephanie Moerkerke, Deputy Director of the Conrad Library; and representatives of the Valier Library (Mayor of Valier, McKenzie Graye, and Valier citizen, Brent Gaylord).

Donath stated the boards had tried to come up with one question for the ballot but could not reach a consensus as to the amounts to be requested. After several attempts, Valier Library decided they would put their question on the ballot. Conrad Board feels they submitted a very conservative amount because they were under the impression that the two issues would be separate questions on the ballot. If the two questions are combined into one, the feeling of the Conrad representatives was that their request was too low.

Gaylord spoke on the need to work together to unite the county not feed the division.

Commissioner Broesder moved to adopt Resolution #28 allowing the combination with the concise wording; Commissioner Christiaens seconded. Question Called.

Discussed were the amounts requested by each library, the reason for the combination of the ballot issues, the documentation of the dollars requested by the Valier library; the understanding of both libraries that they could each have their own ballot

issue on the ballot and related topics. Questions asked that need further research were: whether or not the Conrad Library could withdraw their request for this election; the details of forming library districts and the consequences and/or levying authority if only one library wanted to form a district; one main library with the other as a branch. Commissioner Johnson volunteered to meet with the Conrad library board on Friday March 9th at noon.

Vote called.

RESOLUTION #28 - 2011/12
ALLOWING COMBINING BALLOT ISSUES TO LEVY
TAXES ON ALL PROPERTY OWNERS
IN ORDER TO PROVIDE FUNDING
FOR THE PUBLIC LIBRARIES IN THE COUNTY

WHEREAS the Board of County Commissioners, by its Resolution #26 -2011-12, has approved allowing a ballot issue on the June 5, 2012 countywide ballot for a tax levy request for operating and maintaining the Valier Public Library in the amount of \$69,500; and

WHEREAS the Board of County Commissioners, by its Resolution #27 -2011-12, has approved allowing a ballot issue on the June 5, 2012 countywide ballot for a tax levy request for operating and maintaining the Conrad Public Library in the amount of \$125,000; and

WHEREAS both levy requests are for countywide levies and affect the exact same voters, both levy requests are for the same purpose, i.e., operating funds for the public libraries in Pondera County, both requests are for the same term of years and both commencing in tax year 2014 and both libraries share in the current additional funding provided by the passage of the request for funding in 2006; and

WHEREAS the Board of County Commissioners has determined it to be in the best interest of the county voters to combine the ballot language contained and approved in Resolutions #26 and 27 and direct that one ballot issue be placed on the June 5, 2012 ballot,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners that it is in the best interest of the county voters to combine the ballot language contained and approved in Resolutions #26 and 27 and direct that one ballot issue be placed on the June 5, 2012 ballot in order that the voters may approve or disapprove an additional mill levy to provide \$125,000 each year, plus an inflationary factor allowed by Montana law, beginning with tax year 2014, for eight (8) years for the purpose of funding the operations of the Conrad Public Library and to provide \$69,500 each year, plus an inflationary factor allowed by Montana law, beginning with tax year 2014, for eight (8) years for the purpose of funding the operations of the Valier Public Library; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, subject to the approval of the Pondera County Clerk and Recorder and County Attorney, the form on the ballot shall be as follows:

PONDERA COUNTY PUBLIC LIBRARY TAX LEVY

Shall the Pondera County Commissioners be authorized to levy sufficient additional mills on all taxable property within Pondera County to generate \$194,500 (approximately 14.0 mills), plus an inflationary factor allowed by Montana law, each year for eight years, beginning with tax year 2014, to provide funding to operate and maintain library services at the Conrad and Valier Public Libraries?

The financial impact of the total of \$194,500 on a home having a market value of \$50,000 is estimated to be \$9.16 each year of the levy, \$18.33 for a home having a market value of \$100,000 and \$36.65 for a home having a market value of \$200,000.

Of the total funding requested, the Conrad Library would receive \$125,000, plus an inflationary factor allowed by Montana law, and the Valier Library would receive \$69,500, plus an inflationary factor allowed by Montana law.

Additional Information: In 2006, the voters approved a levy request which expires in 2014. Approximately \$104,419 of this levy request is a continuation of the 2006 approved request. The remainder of this request, approximately \$90,081, is to replace county funding that will no longer be levied for the libraries, beginning with tax year 2014.

SPECIAL MEETING CONDUCTED TO FINALIZE LANGUAGE ON BALLOT ISSUE FOR PUBLIC LIBRARIES – March 12, 2012

The commissioners met with Carolyn Donath, Director of the Conrad Library, Cathy Brandvold, Director of the Valier Library, Mary Brooke, Member of the Valier Library Board, Mckenzie Graye, Mayor of Valier, and Brent Gaylord to discuss the final language for the ballot issue for the June 5, 2012 ballot. Also in attendance were Leo Malinek of Valier and Pat Becker of Conrad.

Following the discussion, Commissioner Christiaens moved to approve the final ballot language for the public library tax levy as follows:

PUBLIC LIBRARIES TAX LEVY

Shall the Pondera County Commissioners be authorized to levy sufficient additional mills on all taxable property within Pondera County to generate \$234,500 (approximately 16.88 mills), plus an inflationary factor allowed by Montana law, each year for eight years, beginning with tax year 2014, to provide funding to operate and maintain library services at the Conrad and Valier Public Libraries?

The financial impact of the total of \$234,500 on a home having a market value of \$50,000 is estimated to be \$11.05 each year of the levy, \$22.10 for a home having a market value of \$100,000 and \$44.20 for a home having a market value of \$200,000.

Of the total funding requested, the Conrad Library would receive \$165,000, plus an inflationary factor allowed by Montana law, and the Valier Library would receive \$69,500, plus an inflationary factor allowed by Montana law.

Additional Information: In 2006, the voters approved a levy request which expires in 2014. Approximately \$104,419 (7.52 mills) of this levy request is a continuation of the 2006 approved request. Approximately \$48,810 (3.48 mills) of this request is to replace county funding that will no longer be levied for the libraries, beginning with tax year 2014. Approximately \$81,271 (5.85 mills) of this request will be used for past shortfalls and continued operations.

MEETING WITH KYLE HARLAN REGARDING ADA COMPLIANCE AT PONDERA CENTER – March 14, 2012

Kyle Harlan met with the commissioners regarding a question raised by a citizen concerning the Pondera Center and compliance with the Americans With Disabilities Act. He stated the Center is in compliance and that he has talked to the citizen advising him that compliance has been met.

NEIGHBORHOOD STABILIZATION PROGRAM AGREEMENT APPROVED – March 14, 2012

Commissioner Broesder moved to approve the Neighborhood Stabilization Program Contract Amendment #MT-NSP-018-01-001C-1. The amendment is to the September 23, 2009 agreement and extends the expenditure program to March 19, 2012. Currently, the projects involved are located at 219 1st Ave NE in Brady, 106 S Montana St in Conrad and 16 N Virginia, also in Conrad. Commissioner Christiaens seconded; motion carried.

REQUEST TO EXTEND TIME TO USE EXCESS VACATION APPROVED- March 14, 2012

State law allows a public employee to accumulate annual vacation leave totaling not more than two times the maximum number of days earned annually. Hours in excess of the two year allowable accrual are forfeited by the employee unless used by March 31st or an extension of time to use the excess is granted.

Sheriff Kuka requested the Commissioners approve an extension of time for Joan Farnstrom to use her excess annual leave hours due to staff shortages. Commissioner Christiaens moved to grant an extension of time to use excess leave hours to Joan Farnstrom. Commissioner Broesder seconded; motion carried.

PAYMENT APPROVED FOR ATTORNEY FEES FOR CLERK OF COURT – March 14, 2012

Commissioner Broesder moved to pay the March 6, 2012 attorney fees of Burk, Lee & Bieler in the amount of \$76.00 for services rendered as defense counsel for Kara Thompson, Clerk of Court. The total paid to date is \$3,866.86. Commissioner Christiaens seconded; motion carried.

REPRESENTATIVE NAMED TO CONDUCT PUBLIC SALE OF VEHICLE- March 14, 2012

The County will be selling a vehicle at public auction on Wednesday, March 28th and the Commissioners will all be absent attending the meetings of the Montana Association of Road Supervisors. Commissioner Christiaens moved to appoint Sheriff Tom Kuka or his appointee to represent the County and conduct the auction. Commissioner Broesder seconded; motion carried.

APPROACH AGREEMENT APPROVED- March 21, 2012

Commissioner Christiaens moved to approve the Approach Agreement requested by Jim Nelson to encroach upon the Pondera County Road Right of Way described as the Bullhead Road (T30N, R4W, Section 8) for the purpose of installing a temporary approach on the south side of the road, with a no culvert. Commissioner Broesder moved to approve the Approach Agreement requested by Kip DeBoo to encroach upon the Pondera County Road Right of Way described as the Belgian Hill Road (T29N, R3W, Section 6: SW4) for the purpose of installing an approach on the east side of the road, with a 15” culvert. OPPOSING THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE'S PROPOSALS/PLANS TO RELAX OR CHANGE THE CURRENT POSTAL SERVICE STANDARDS, CLOSE POST OFFICES, AND CONSOLIDATE MAIL PROCESSING CENTERS

WHEREAS the citizens of Pondera County rely on the United States Postal Service (Postal Service) to deliver items timely, six-days per week to conduct commerce and to obtain goods and information not available locally, and

WHEREAS many of our citizens, including the chronically ill, senior citizens, the disabled, and veterans rely on the Postal Service for timely delivery of medical supplies necessary for survival, and

WHEREAS rural areas are being required to shoulder a disproportionate burden in an attempt to balance the Postal Service's budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Pondera County Commissioners that it opposes relaxing or changing the current postal service standards, closing of post offices, and consolidating mail processing centers that will adversely affect our citizens and it opposes the Postal Service's proposal to eliminate quality jobs in our communities and recognizes the efforts of our local postal workers; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners request the Postal Service, Postal Regulatory Commission, and our Congressional Delegation provide detailed, transparent information that shows the true and accurate cost savings of changing/relaxing service standards, closures, and consolidations.
